Facts on Nonprofit Organizations in Canada

- Canada is home to the second-largest nonprofit workforce in the world. It is a dynamic sector that contributes **\$112 billion** to our economy each year.
- **Ninety-one percent of Canadians** agree with the statement, “Generally, charitable and voluntary organizations play a major role in making our communities better places to live.” (envision.ca)
- Nonprofit organizations work in a **wide variety of areas** such as: sports and recreation; religion; social services; grant-making, fundraising and voluntarism promotion; arts and culture; and development and housing.
- Most nonprofit organizations (63%) focus their services on the local **neighbourhood, city, or rural municipality** where they are located. Another 19% serve a specific region of their province or territory, or the province as a whole (8%).
- **Volunteers frequently outnumber paid employees** at nonprofit organizations. Over half of all nonprofit and voluntary organizations in Ontario and Canada have no paid staff.
- The value of volunteer contribution in Canada is estimated at **\$14.1 billion** dollars.

Facts about the Nonprofit Sector in London

- London has over **1150 nonprofit and charitable organizations**.
- It would take **6 full time employees** to replace the work of volunteers in each of London’s nonprofits. These volunteers contributed over **\$303 million dollars** with their time as their hard work and dedication to the nonprofit sector continue to improve our community.
- Pillar Nonprofit Network has over **150 nonprofit organization members** across London and connects close to **15,000 Londoners** to nonprofit organizations annually through its programs and services.
